1. Approval of Meeting Minutes from April 16, 2018

Board members approved the minutes.

2. Bottineau LRT Project: Status Update

Staff provided an update on the LRT project schedule. The project is in a holding pattern as ongoing negotiations with the BNSF Railroad continue.

Mayor Harris updated the JPA on the joint lobbying effort by the Blue Line Now! Coalition.to secure federal funds and to provide incentives for BNSF participation in the project.

Staff provided an update on draft items to be included in a Land Acquisition Cost to Sure Payment Agreement that will negotiated with the Bottineau Project Office later in 2019.

3. 2018 & 2019 Capital Improvement Projects: Information and Discussion

Staff provided information on the 2018 Dog Park addition to Sochacki, and the plans to install trail benches and do trail repair in 2019.

Council Member Fonnest encouraged staff to reach out to Courage Kenny to engage them in discussion about future park design and about programming potentials.

4. 5-Year Capital Improvement Plan: Motion to Approve

Staff provided a handout and overview of the proposed 5-year (2019-2023) Capital Improvement Program (CIP) for Sochacki.

Mayor Murphy requested that vegetation management on the west side of the trail and road include plantings to be done as soon as feasible so that they are more established for screening prior to opening of the LRT.

For the next CIP, staff will include a graphical representation of the CIP in the form of a map that shows what is to be proposed to be done and when.

A motion to approve the 2019-2023 Sochacki Capital Improvement Program was made by Mayor Harris and seconded by Commissioner Freeman. The motion was approved unanimously.

5. BMX Area: Information and Discussion

The City of Robbinsdale conducted an environmental assessment of the soils at the BMX area. No contaminants were found.

The Operations Committee recommended that the BMX area be treated as a local amenity developed by neighborhood kids, and that the area should continue to be monitored for safety. The BMX area will be removed from Sochacki reference maps since it is not an official park amenity. In the future it may be appropriate to formally upgrade the facility.

JPA members indicated support for the Operations Committee recommendations.

6. Programming Update: Information and Discussion

Staff provided an overview of the 2018 programming activities and a preview of the 2019 planned programs. JPA members requested that program materials be shared via appropriate staff with JPA Board members so that they could help with promotion. Additional suggestions including working with the local cable channel and development of a Twitter tag for Sochacki.

MOTION TO DIRECT THE JPA OPERATIONS STAFF TO CREATE AND IMPLEMENT A WATER RESOURCES PLAN FOR THE SOUTH AND NORTH RICE POND WETLAND COMPLEX WITHIN SOCHACKI PARK.

Staff will provide a verbal update of discussions to date with local residents who have expressed concerns about the water quality in the wetland complex.

Three Rivers is willing to take the lead in developing and implementing a water quality plan for the park. Funding for the development of such a plan has been identified in Three River's CIP for 2020.

Development of the plan will be overseen by a steering committee whose members will include the Sochacki JPA Partners, Bassett Creek WMO, any other cities within the sub-watershed, and a citizen representative from the neighborhood adjacent to the south pond.

In addition, Three Rivers proposes to implement a first point of contact for water quality issues in Sochacki Park.
